# LENT reminds us the Lord is always with us ...

Ash Wednesday is a day of huge significance for us as Catholic community. On that day we begin our journey of Lent, forty days of turning back to God, forty days of re-examining our lives through the lens of our faith, forty days of pushing the reset button on how we live in relationship with God, with one another and with ourselves.

Lent is never about adding to the difficulty of what we are all experiencing around the world with pandemic of Covid19 – far from it. Rather, Lent presents us with the most powerful reminder that, in the face of the turmoil and pain, the tremendous suffering of this world, the Lord is with us, by His Cross we have been healed, by His Cross we have been saved and by His Cross we have hope. The risen Lord walks with us and calls us to rediscover and share with others the grace and joy of life lived with Him.

Who among us will ever forget the stark, solitary image of Pope Francis in St Peter's Square on that wet and dark evening in Lent last year. I want to remind you of something he said that evening that may help us as we set out on our journey of Lent. In that moment of prayer Pope Francis reminded us of the words we hear in the reading from the Prophet Joel on Ash Wednesday, '**Return to me with all your heart**'. In the very circumstances of our lives with its very particular experiences of loss, isolation and fear, God is saying, 'come back to me'. This is an invitation – not a demand. It is ours to accept or reject.

Going back to that rain drenched St Peter's Square, Pope Francis reminded us, that this is a time of choosing, a time of our choosing, a time to choose what matters and what passes away, a time to separate what is necessary from what is not. The past year has taught us an awful lot about priorities. If Lent is about getting our priorities right, about getting our life back on track, if it is about returning to God with all our heart, I ask you, what might that mean for you in real and concrete ways this Lent, what choices are you being called to?
